**UPCOMING EVENTS:** The feast of the Presentation of the Lord is on Saturday, 2 February 2016. It commemorates the time when Mary and Joseph presented Jesus in the temple forty days after his birth, according to Jewish custom. There Jesus was proclaimed by Simeon to be the "light of revelation to the nations and the glory of Israel" (Luke 2:32). On this feast the church traditionally blesses the candles used throughout the year. The monastic community marks this great feast with a *Lucernarium*, a beautiful candlelight procession and service of psalms and readings on the eve of the feast. All are invited to the *Lucernarium* on Friday, 1 February 2016 at 7:15 p.m. in the Abbey Church.

**JANUARY SAINTS:** What we know of Ss. Maur and Placid, the first disciples of St. Benedict, comes from the *Dialogues* of St. Gregory the Great (d. 604 AD). St. Maur, Abbot and Deacon, son of Equitius, a nobleman of Rome, was born about the year 510 and died in 584. When he was about twelve years old, his father placed him under the care of St. Benedict at Subiaco, to be educated in piety and learning. When he had grown up, St. Benedict chose him as his successor as superior. He was a model of perfection to his brethren, but especially in obedience.

St. Placid, one of his fellow disciples, the son of the senator Tertullus, going one day to draw

water, fell into the lake, and was at once carried away by the current. St. Benedict saw this in spirit in his cell and made Maur run and draw him out. Having asked and received the holy father Benedict's blessing, Maur hastened down to the lake, walked on the water, thinking he was on dry land, and dragged Placid out by the hair, without sinking. Maur attributed the miracle to the command and prayers of St. Benedict, who rather said it was due to his disciple's obedience.

St. Maur was sent to France in 543 to propagate the Order of St. Benedict in that country. He founded the famous Abbey of Glanfeuil, over which he ruled as Abbot for thirty-eight years. In 581 he resigned the abbacy, built for himself a small cell near the church of St. Martin, so that in solitude and prayer he might prepare himself for his passage into eternity. After two years he fell sick from a fever; he received the sacraments of the Church, lying on sackcloth before the altar of St. Martin. In that posture he expired on January 15, 584. A prayer St. Maur offered centuries ago is often employed for healing of the sick.
