**ALL SAINTS DAY:** Mass will be on Tuesday, 1 November 2016 at 9:45 a.m. with the school community. Solemn Vespers (**without Mass**) will be sung at 5:15 p.m. All are most welcome!

**ALL SOULS DAY:** We inaugurate the month of remembrance on All Souls Day as we commend to the Lord the faithful departed. You are welcome to join us for the *Requiem Mass* on Wednesday, 2 November 2016 at 5:15 p.m., with Latin plainchant. All are welcome!

**CHRIST THE KING:** Recently elected Abbot President of the American Cassinese Congregation (of which St. Mary's Abbey is a member), Abbot Elias has returned to the Abbey and will be the celebrant on Sunday, 20 November 2016. The liturgy is also in thanksgiving to God for this honor and a welcome home to Abbot Elias. Don't miss this festive liturgy!

**NOVEMBER SAINT:** Dating from the 3<sup>rd</sup> century, St. Cecilia is one of the Roman martyrs mentioned in the Roman Canon ([Eucharistic Prayer I](#)). A church stands over the ruins of her house in Rome's Trastevere. Ongoing archeological work there reveals many wonderful ancient Roman ruins, including the bathroom where Cecilia is believed to have been martyred.

A 5<sup>th</sup> century legend, however, provides much of what we know about Cecilia. Having vowed chastity, Cecilia refused to consummate her marriage to pagan Valerian. He and his brother, Tiburtius, converted to Christianity and were soon martyred. Cecilia buried her husband and brother-in-law and was soon arrested by the Romans. Refusing to sacrifice according to pagan practice she was to be suffocated in her bathroom. But Cecilia didn't die, so a soldier was sent to behead her. Three strikes of the sword failed to kill Cecilia and she lingered for three days. After her death, Pope Urban consecrated her house as a shrine.

Regretably contemporary evidence does not corroborate this legend, though a historic matron named Cecilia did found a church in Trastevere, and may be at the heart of the legend. The relics of Cecilia were translated to the Trastevere church in the 9<sup>th</sup> century. When the church was rebuilt in 1599, the tomb was opened and Cecilia's body was incorrupt but soon disintegrated due to its contact with air.

Since the 16<sup>th</sup> century Cecilia has been the patron saint of music, likely due to aniphon taken from her acts: "As the organs were playing Cecilia



sung to the Lord, saying: 'May my heart remain unsullied, so that I not be confounded.'"

English poets Alexander Pope and John Dryden wrote to honor St. Cecilia, the latter of which has been brilliantly set to music by Handel and Purcell.
